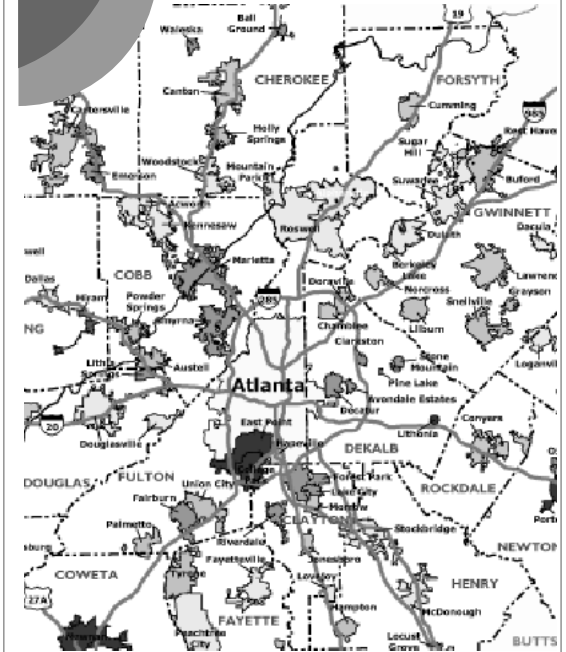

The Purpose of the Metro Equity Summit

This Metro Equity Summit is intended to inform a group of like-minded socially conscious people of the inequities in the Metropolitan Atlanta Region.

Groups and individuals do not come by coincidence, but because of their commitment to make a difference in their community.

Individuals and groups have little to no power to address the inequities they will hear about at this event, but as a cohesive group they can become empowered.

- ◆ United, we are powerful!
- ◆ Informed, we are powerful!
- ◆ Financed, we are powerful!

People plus money equal power!

The objective of this summit is to provide participants with enough information to take planned, powerful actions.

- ◆ Actions without a plan will fail.
- ◆ Action without power will fail.

Once informed, participants have the opportunity to become a power that speaks with the moral voice of systemic change for the powerless. This summit will give each participant the chance that they've been looking for to:

- ◆ have a positive impact on the Metro Atlanta Region.
- ◆ change this region systemically for the better.

A successful summit will spin-off a minimum of five actions and a minimum of 20 new organizations commit to an interest level in ABLE. We invite all participants to become active in ABLE.

ABLE/Gamaliel is a faith-based, metropolitan-wide, multi-racial community organization. It works to bring people together across the lines that divide the region: race, class, language, political boundaries and political ideologies.

ABLE/Gamaliel intends to be a powerful, broadly-based coalition of congregations, unions, and civic organizations that can affect change at local, metropolitan and statewide levels.

ABLE/Gamaliel is a vehicle where people find common ground to express common values and work for the common good of all.

ABLE/Gamaliel exists to identify leaders, then nurture, train and develop those leaders so that together their voices can be heard.
