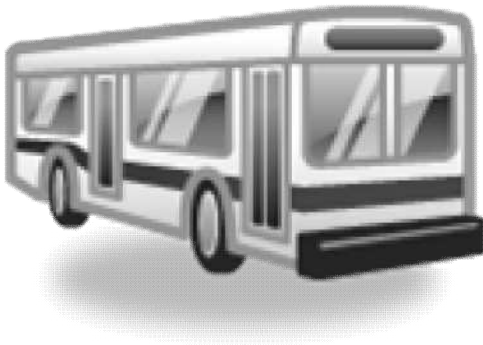


# Help Shape the Historic Decision to Bring Health Care to All Americans
